Coyote Alert

You may have read on Nextdoor-Winter Woods recently several posts about coyotes in the Winter Park area. This is just a reminder that coyotes roam our neighborhoods in search of shelter and, of course, food. Coyotes live in every state in the US except Hawaii. Coyotes are curious but are also timid and will run away if challenged. These animals resemble a small German Shepherd dog and weigh between 15 and 30 pounds. The coyote diet consists of just about anything they can find including pet food, fruits, nuts, seeds, dead animals, and rodents, as well as domestic cats and small dogs. Coyotes will also eat garbage if they can get to it. Please make sure



that your garbage cans are securely closed when you put them out for collection and that you are not leaving dishes of pet food outside.

Most coyote attacks on animals occur overnight, at dawn, or at dusk. If you can avoid walking your dogs at these times, it is best to do so. If you must walk your dog during these peak attack times, please be sure to keep your dog on a short leash. And please keep your cats indoors over night. To protect your animals when you walk them, you might consider carrying a large squirt gun, walking stick, golf club or air horn with you. Sales tax holiday for disaster-preparedness supplies

The following products will be exempt from <u>Florida sales and use tax</u> from 12:01 a.m. on May 31, 2019, through 11:59 p.m. on June 6, 2019:

AAA-cell, AA-cell, C-cell, D-cell, 6-volt, or 9-volt batteries, excluding automobile and boat batteries (\$30 or less)

Gas or diesel fuel tanks (\$25 or less)

Ground anchor systems or tie-down kits (\$50 or less)

Non-electric food storage coolers (\$30 or less)

Portable generators used to provide light or communications or to preserve food in the event of a power outage (\$750 or less)

Portable self-powered light sources (\$20 or less)

Portable self-powered radios, two-way radios, or weather-band radios (\$50 or less)

Reusable ice such as ice packs (\$10 or less)

Tarpaulins or other flexible waterproof sheeting (\$50 or less)

CAUTION --- Never run a generator or use outdoor cooking equipment in the garage, inside the house or next to an open door or window. Carbon monoxide is odorless and colorless and can kill your family.

Year-Round Vegetable Gardening—Al Baker



As we enter the hot summer months the choice of plants that can thrive and can take the heat changes dramatically. Did you ever wonder how people lived in hot climates in times past? Well they grew the foods that love the suns heat. Before I give you a list of what to plant let's talk about how to prepare the soil. Good soil is good because it is teeming with millions of microbes. But microbes don't like to

be fried and dried by the sun. They multiply when the soil is protected with a reasonable amount of foliage. This means we should always try to cover as much of the ground around your plants as possible. Good ground covers are leaves, organic ground up mulch, straw or better yet hay if available. Almost anything will work including paper cardboard, even newspaper. Your plants will flourish and remain healthy all

summer long. Here are the most common plants that you should consider: Cherry tomatoes, yard long beans (often called snake beans or Asian beans) Eggplant, Seminole squash, wing beans, Malabar spinach, and watermelon. Onions and most peppers will grow if planted before the heat hits. So, get started today and have some hot fun in the summertime.
