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NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH—Larry Stephey

A rise in the numbers of door-to-door solicitations was mentioned in a recent meeting of the Winter Woods HOA Board of Directors. The governing law is quite complex, but is summarized here:

In brief, it says "persons who engage in sale, lease, or rental of consumer goods or services with a purchase price in excess of \$25 . . . are required to obtain a Home Solicitation Sale Permit." You may ask to see this permit.

The list of exceptions contained in the law is quite long but if you have a prior relationship, such as a telephone appointment, the permit is not required. Also "Solicitors, salespersons, or agents making calls or soliciting orders on behalf of a religious, charitable, scientific, educational, or veterans' institution. . . ." are excluded from the permit requirement.

If you suspect a salesperson is soliciting without a permit, you could notify the sheriff using the non-emergency number of 407-665-6650.

Posting a "No Solicitation" sign is a warning to potential sales folk that you could enforce a "No Trespass" order against them.



STREETS & LIGHTING—Greg

Streets: After the great repairs on Poinciana, we are in good shape pavement wise here in Winter Woods. I have called in the potholes on Howell Branch Road in front of St John's Episcopal Church again as there are new potholes that have developed that make our commutes rougher than they should be. I also called Casselberry water to repair one of their pipe covers that have been coming off on King James Court and Nottingham.

Lighting: I received a text that a light was out on King Alpines Court and immediately the next day I called Duke Energy to have it repaired. Duke came out but couldn't repair it on the first visit so they had to run a new electrical line to it, which added days to the repair. There is a light out on Winter Woods Boulevard that was also called in. Currently, there are two lights I am monitoring.

Sidewalks: Inspections are coming up in April.

Meet Your Neighbor—By Laura Spear



Al and Kathy Baker landed on King Henrys CT 30 years ago after spending 7 years in Key West. Originally from Michigan, they moved to Winter Park because Kathy's sister was in the area. They found a perfect home on a cul-de-sac with a big back yard to plant tropical foliage, trees, a garden and raise 6 children. Now empty nesters, Al is a Certified Financial Planner who alternates between his office in Lake Mary and his home office, while Kathy is an instructional para-professional in Seminole County Schools and plans on retiring next year. They love to travel, including trips to Europe and visiting friends and family. This year they're getting ready to go to Belgium, last year it was an extended trip to Italy, Switzerland and Germany. They visit family every couple of years in Michigan and travel to Tennessee to see good friends.

When they are not travelling, Al is tending his large garden. He began gardening when he was 6 years old and has gardened his whole life. Right now, he has about 20 crops including beans, many types of squash, 4 different kinds of kale and fennel. His advice to other gar-

deners is "There's no such thing as a green thumb, it's hard work, enhancing the soil, and starting with the right seeds. Most of the time crops fail because the seeds are bad if you buy from a local home improvement store. Your seeds are almost always going to be bad because they store them in a high humidity warehouse and it destroys the yield so I wouldn't buy there, I'd buy online."

Al and Kathy love the Winter Woods neighborhood because it's easy access to downtown, Winter Park, the airport, and a lot of great restaurants. They're always checking out the nearby Asian, Mediterranean, pizza, and smoothie places. They love being active, you'll see them around Winter Woods walking most evenings. "We've been doing that for 30 years," said Al, "and we try to go at least a mile. I encourage everybody who's reading this to walk every night because it does keep you healthy!' Al also is a board member of a local chess club and plays speed chess on weekends.

The Bakers have done their share of remodeling over the years, including removing the screens in the back porch to open up the house to the backyard, investing in their home because they love the neighborhood. As Al puts it, "I wish there was a way to get all of the people who live in this great neighborhood involved with our homeowner's association. The closer our community is, the less crime you have, the less problems you have, it just makes a happier place to live. This is one of the few places where you can live where you can feel safe, and you can raise your children. In 30 years, we never had any problems and I think part of it is because everybody's vigilant and everybody's aware of what's going on. It's just great to be a part of this community."
