I did a follow-up call on the 12th to Duke Energy and had about a 30 minute conversation about this light that needs to be fixed here. They told me that hurricane Milton pushed the repair back, but they now know how critical it is to get this light fixed as it is pitch dark down that street. The street light out on Japonica is the same reason.

Sidewalks: Our sidewalks, as you probably know, are getting updated as we speak. Thank you, Seminole County, for getting our sidewalks up to par to eliminate and/or minimize trip hazards.





Orange County is dealing with an above average crime rate around Aloma Ave, and south of the area. The Seminole Sheriff Department continues to have the reputation of being tough on crime and the bad guys tend to stay away from the county.

There is no reason to let down our guard, though. Watchful neighbors with the willingness to report suspicious activity is a major deterrent to neighborhood crime. We note that pet walkers are active at all hours and the quiet of the neighborhood allows for the noticing of unusual noises such as breaking glass and busting doors.
