

# Lithium Battery Safety— SCFD

# Seminole County Fire Department Urges Residents to "Take Charge" of Lithium-Ion Battery Safety

Lithium-ion batteries power many of the devices we rely on daily – from smartphones and scooters to e-bikes, power tools, and even home energy storage systems. But while these batteries make life more convenient, they also carry hidden fire risks.

The <u>Seminole County Fire Department (SCFD</u>) has launched a countywide education campaign to help residents understand and reduce the dangers of lithium-ion battery fires. "Lithium-ion battery fires burn hotter, faster, and more persistently than ordinary fires," says Lt. Paul Hammerl, member of SCFD's Energy Response Team. "We've seen first-hand how a damaged or improperly charged battery can ignite and even reignite hours later. Education is the key to preventing tragedy."

SCFD recommends residents **take C.H.A.R.G.E.** of **Battery Safety** (as <u>recommended by the Fire Safety Research Institute</u>):

- Choose certified products.
- Handle with care.
- Always stay alert for warning signs like swelling, smoke, or hissing.
- Recycle batteries at approved locations—never in household trash.
- Get out quickly if there's a fire.
- Educate others on safe practices.

Lithium-ion batteries contain flammable electrolytes that could ignite when included in regular waste pick-up. The public can recycle lithium-ion and rechargeable batteries Monday-Saturday, 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at the Central Transfer Station located at 1950 FL-419, Longwood, FL, 32750.

Residents can also download the Charge into Fire Safety™: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home Tip Sheet on the National Fire Prevent on the National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA) website. For more information and safety resources, visit nfpa.org.

# <u>Lithium-ion Battery Safety: Top 10 Facts & Prevention Tips</u>

Lithium-ion batteries power many everyday devices—phones, laptops, e-bikes, scooters, power tools, and even electric vehicles. While essential, they also carry risks when misused. Knowing both the facts and the proper prevention steps can help protect lives and property.

# 1. Widespread Use

Lithium-ion batteries are found in nearly every portable electronic device, as well as in larger systems like EVs and e-bikes. **Tip:** Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for charging and storage and use only the cord and power adapter made for your device.

# 2. Fires Can Reignite

Battery fires may reignite hours—or even days—after the initial incident. **Tip:** If a fire occurs, call emergency responders and never attempt to reuse a damaged battery. **CONTINUED ON PAGE 8**

# 3. Documented Risks

Between 1995–2023, over 1,500 incidents were reported in the U.S., causing more than 600 injuries and 100 deaths. These fires keep increasing every year. **Tip:** Protect yourself by purchasing only reputable, tested batteries and chargers—avoid cheap or counterfeit products.

# 4. Escape Time Is Short

These types of fires spread extremely quickly—residents may have less than one minute to escape once smoke or hissing appears. **Tip:** Keep charging stations and batteries out of hallways or escape routes so exits remain clear.

## 5. Toxic Smoke

Burning batteries release white, toxic smoke containing hydrogen fluoride and other harmful gases. **Tip:** Never charge devices under a pillow, on a bed, or near combustibles.

# 6. Counterfeit Products Increase Risk

Knockoff batteries and chargers have been directly linked to fire incidents. **Tip:** Only buy from trusted manufacturers and retailers with verified safety testing.

# 7. Overcharging and Unattended Charging

Overcharging or leaving devices plugged in overnight is a leading cause of lithium-ion battery fires. **Tip:** Unplug devices once fully charged and avoid charging while you sleep or are away.

# 8. Heat and Flammable Materials

Batteries exposed to heat or placed near flammable materials can ignite. **Tip:** Keep devices at room temperature, away from direct sunlight, and store batteries away from anything flammable.

# 9. Improper Disposal is Dangerous

Loose batteries thrown in the trash can spark fires in garbage trucks and landfills. **Tip:** Dispose of batteries only at hazardous waste facilities or battery recycling drop-off points.

### 10. Awareness Saves Lives

Prevention is the best defense. Fire departments like SCFD have trained all of their first responders on these incidents.

**Tip:** Educate your household and coworkers about safe charging and storage practices—awareness is key.


