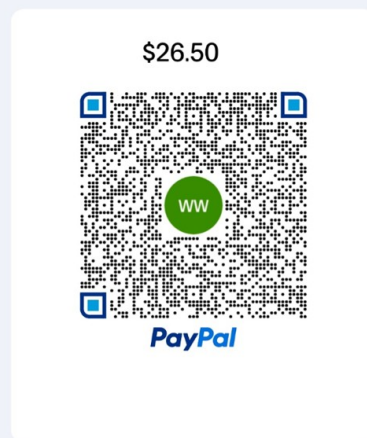

## 2026 Florida Tax-Free Holidays

Floridians can take advantage of these tax-free opportunities to save on emergency preparedness items, as well as essential school supplies, clothing, and electronics.

### Emergency Prep

**Dates: January 1 – December 31, 2026**

As of August 1, 2025, many disaster preparedness items are now **PERMANENTLY tax-free year-round in Florida.**

### Permanently Tax-Free Items

- Batteries, Fire Extinguishers, Smoke Detectors, Fuel Cans, and Portable Generators.
- Sunscreen and Insect Repellent are also now permanently exempt.

### Back to School

**Dates: August 1 – August 31, 2026**

### School Supplies

Certain supplies under \$15.00 per item.

### Clothing & Accessories

- Price: \$100 or less per item.  
Includes: Wallets and bags.

### Computers

- Price: \$1,500 or less.  
Includes: Personal computers and accessories for non-commercial use.

### Learning Aids

- Price: \$30 or less.  
Includes: Flashcards and jigsaw puzzles.



Both in-store and online purchases are generally eligible if completed during the holiday period.

Refer to the Florida Department of Revenue for further information, updates on eligible items, and changes to the tax-free programs.

Note: Exemptions do not apply at theme parks, entertainment complexes, or airports.

## Hurricane Preparedness—Part 1

### Hurricane Preparedness in Central Florida: What Winter Park Area Residents Need to Know

Every year, hurricane season reminds Central Florida residents that preparation is not optional. While Orlando is located inland and avoids direct coastal storm surge, the region still faces dangerous threats from hurricanes and tropical storms, including high winds, tornadoes, flash flooding, prolonged power outages, and extreme rainfall. For families in the Orlando area, having a hurricane preparedness plan before a storm develops can make a major difference in safety, comfort, and recovery.

#### Why Hurricane Preparedness Matters in Orlando

Many people assume hurricanes weaken significantly before reaching inland areas like Orlando. While storms often lose some intensity after landfall, Central Florida remains highly vulnerable to severe weather impacts. Hurricanes such as Charley, Irma, and Ian caused extensive flooding, property damage, and widespread power outages throughout the Orlando metropolitan area.

Because Orlando sits in a low-lying region with numerous lakes, canals, and retention ponds, heavy rainfall can quickly overwhelm drainage systems. In addition, strong winds can knock down trees and power lines, leaving neighborhoods without electricity for days.

The Atlantic hurricane season officially runs from June 1 through November 30, with peak activity typically occurring between August and October. Residents should prepare long before a storm appears in the forecast.

#### Build a Hurricane Emergency Kit

Every household in Central Florida should maintain a hurricane emergency supply kit that can support family members for at least seven days. Stores often sell out of essentials quickly once a storm is announced, so preparing early is critical. A complete hurricane kit should include:

- Bottled water (one gallon per person per day)
- Nonperishable food
- Manual can opener
- Flashlights and extra batteries
- Portable phone chargers or power banks
- First aid supplies
- Prescription medications
- Important documents stored in waterproof containers
- Cash in small bills
- Pet food and pet supplies
- Battery-powered weather radio
- Hygiene and sanitation items

Families with infants, elderly relatives, or medical needs should include additional specialized supplies.

#### Understand Orlando's Flood Risks

Flooding is one of the most dangerous hurricane-related threats in Central Florida. Even neighborhoods far from the coast can experience rising water from torrential rain. Streets near lakes, retention ponds, and low-elevation areas may become impassable within hours. **An excellent example of flooding in our neighborhood is Winter Woods Blvd. as well as Nottingham and Coventry near the golf course fence.**

Residents should know whether their home lies in a flood-prone zone and review their insurance coverage carefully. Standard homeowners' insurance policies typically do not cover flood damage. Flood insurance often requires a waiting period before coverage becomes active, making early planning essential.

Drivers should also remember the phrase: "Turn around, don't drown." Many flood-related deaths occur when vehicles attempt to cross flooded roads.
